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Carriage Of Goods By Sea

The law of carriage of goods by sea is a body of law that governs the rights and duties of shippers, carriers and consignees of marine cargo. Primarily concerned with cargo claims, this body of law is an aspect of International commercial law and maritime law. The typical obligations of a carrier by sea to a shipper of cargo are: to provide a seaworthy ship to issue a bill of lading to "properly and carefully load, handle, stow, carry, keep, care for, and discharge the goods carried", to proceed

The Carriage of Goods by Sea Act is a United States statute governing the rights and responsibilities between shippers of cargo and ship-owners regarding ocean shipments to and from the United States. It is the U.S. enactment of the International Convention Regarding Bills of Lading, commonly known as the "Hague Rules". It was found in Title 46 Appendix of the United States Code, starting at Section 1301, but has been moved to a note in 46 United States Code 30701. The United States Congress, co

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A carriage contract shall be concluded for these purposes. The individuals, organizations, or associations carrying goods are referred to as carriers. Goods may be transported by land, sea, or air, including inland waterways. The legislation on the movement of goods is, therefore, included in the following provisions:

The Carriage of Goods by Sea Act ("COGSA") in Singapore gives effect to the Hague-Visby Rules ("the Rules"); see s 3 (1) of COGSA which provides that the provisions of the Rules "shall have the force of law". This has the effect of making the application of the Rules mandatory. Singapore is a signatory to the Rules.

The Carriers Act has never been applicable to private carriers and to common carriers by sea or by inland waterway. If part of the carriage is by sea or inland water and part by road, the act applies to the land part only. For many decades the law governing the international carriage of goods by railway has been codified in a number of international conventions.

The contract of carriage of goods by sea can easily be seen as a contract involving two parties who for an agreed sum agree to be bound by the terms reached by them. But this definition may be very misleading, for though the contract of carriage involve this important element it is not the same as the usual contracts reached and agreed by parties.

PARTIES UNDER THE CONTRACT OF CARRIAGE OF GOODS BY SEA

- "This Bill of Lading, so far as it relates to the carriage of goods by water, shall have effect, subject to the provisions of the Carriage of Goods by Sea Act of the United States, approved April 16, 1936, which shall be deemed to be incorporated herein, and nothing herein contained shall be deemed a surrender by the carrier of any of its rights or immunities or an increase of any of its responsibilities or liabilities under said Act.

Subject to the provisions of Article VI, under every contract of carriage of goods by sea the carrier, in relation to the loading, handling, stowage, carriage, custody, care, and discharge of such goods, shall be subject to the responsibilities and liabilities, and entitled to the rights and immunities hereinafter set forth.
